- Divorce is not God’s ideal design (Mal.2:16), but in certain circumstances it is permitted (Deut.24, Mt.19)...

**v.12-16**—Unbeliever wants out, let them out...

**v.17-40**—Time’s short, priority on being the Bride of Christ (2Cor.11:2, Rev.21)...
